DIOCESE OF LEEDS SCHOOLS SINGING PROGRAMME AND KEYBOARD STUDIES PROGRAMME

The Diocese of Leeds Schools Singing Programme is recognised as the UK's leading choral education programme, striving to make outstanding singing tuition, music education and performance opportunities accessible to children and young people in communities which are least likely to encounter them. The programme reaches around 6,000 children weekly, both during and outside the school day in over 150 choral groups, including boys' and girls' choirs in Bradford, Huddersfield, Keighley, Pontefract and Wakefield, together with the six choirs of Leeds Cathedral. Their schools and choral work during the pandemic received a prestigious Royal Philharmonic Society Inspiration Award, with their digital singing sessions and virtual choir recordings receiving over 75,000 views on YouTube.

The Leeds Cathedral Choirs draw their membership from inner-city Leeds state schools with children recruited through weekly Schools Singing Programme sessions. Acknowledged as among the finest in the country, the choirs sing eight cathedral services a week and perform regularly in BBC broadcasts, concerts and recordings. The Cathedral Choirs broadcast Midnight Mass for BBC One in 2017 and BBC Radio 4 in 2018 and their recordings of choral works by Maurice Duruflé and Arvo Pärt for Brilliant Classics have received critical acclaim.

In May 2016, the Keyboard Studies Programme was launched to provide high-quality organ and piano tuition across the Diocese, to children and adults alike. With a national decline in students learning the organ, the programme aims to reintroduce this instrument steeped in tradition to students of all backgrounds, teaching them valuable musical skills and opening doors to opportunities in further education and choral direction. To broaden pathways to the organ, we have started lessons on other keyboard instruments, now providing piano and accordion lessons. In September, we began teaching group melodica in Diocesan primary schools. The programme now involves almost 1,000 children learning each week.


